










Reading

Read to and listen to your child reading every day. Use the school books, join the library.











Share a book

Listen to your child read (Phonics) Retell the story, talk about characters

As a parent or carer, how else can I help with my child's learning?

- Make time every day to talk and listen to your child. Talking to them helps them to learn and understand new words and ideas. It will make a real difference to your child's confidence as a young learner.
- All the activities that you do with your child at home such as cutting, drawing, playing games, are important and have a really long lasting effect as they progress through school.
- Play outside. Exercise in the fresh air helps your child's physical and mental development.

Talk to your child at every opportunity – e.g. what you are doing that day

Talk about the numbers, colours, words and letters you see when you are out and about

On a trip to the supermarket, talk about all the different packaging shapes

Cook / bake together

Allow your child to cut out and stick pictures from magazines

Sing and tell nursery rhymes

Use the weather – shadows, rain puddles, snow, wind, mist and sun – to extend your child's vocabulary

Explore the park at a different time of the year – go off the beaten track

Plant seeds or bulbs in a pot or garden patch

How can I find out how my child is getting on?

- The most important place to find out about your child's progress is **your child's teacher** do ask as many questions as you need to. We really do welcome speaking with you.
- It is important that you and the professionals caring for your child work together. You need to feel comfortable about exchanging information and discussing things that will benefit your child. These conversations will be with your child's "key person"- either a teacher or an EYE. This is the person who:
- Helps your child to become settled, happy and safe
- Is responsible for your child's care, development and learning
- Takes a careful note of your child's progress, sharing this with you and giving you ideas as to how to help your child at home
