Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) 2018-2019 Report/Policy Statement

What is Pupil Premium?

The pupil premium grant (PPG) is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gap between them and their peers.

- £1,320 per pupil for each Ever 6 FSM FTE pupil aged 4 and over in year groups reception to year 6, except where the pupil is allocated the LAC or post-LAC premium.
- £2,300 per pupil for each post-LAC in year groups reception to year 11.
- £300 for each pupil aged 4 and over in year groups reception to year 11 who is either Ever 6 service child FTE or in receipt of pensions under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (AFCS) and the War Pensions Scheme (WPS).

Principles for supporting socially disadvantaged pupils:

At Stockwell Primary School we ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils by doing some of the following:

- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups; this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are specifically assessed and addressed.
- In considering provision for socially disadvantaged pupils we recognise that not all pupils eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) will be socially disadvantaged. We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are eligible for FSM.
- Pupil Premium funding will be allocated based on a needs analysis, reflecting these considerations and which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals.

Aims

- To ensure that PP pupils in year 6 receive targeted support in English and maths.
- To ensure that PP pupils year 2 receive targeted support in English and maths.
- To ensure that PP pupils in years 1 and 2 receive targeted support in Phonics teaching.
- To accelerate progress of the PP pupils in years 3, 4 and 5.
- To improve attendance and punctuality of PP pupils across the school.
- To support targeted PP pupils with homework.
- To support targeted PP pupils with their social and emotional needs.
- To support pupils with removing barriers to their learning through group work, mentoring and attendance.

To accelerate progress of the PP pupils in years 3, 4 and 5.	Interventions across the school	Progress data is fully analysed to identify pupils in English and maths that require further support to ensure they reach their full potential and progress. A variety of support and intervention groups are allocated across the school for all abilities. Higher ability PP pupils are supported in English and Maths groups through higher order thinking. Phonics interventions are supporting pupils to attain the phonics check level of assessment through daily repetition. 1:1 tuition supports SEND pupils in receipt of PP funding. Stringent monitoring and review throughout the year ensures that all pupils are making expected rates of progress and adjustments are made accordingly.	Total amount: £54,350

Subsidised Breakfast and Afterschool club for PP pupils	Breakfast club is provided for families struggling to complete the morning routines and arrive at school on time. After school clubs are provided to support families with work and home commitments. Hot meals are provided daily in after school club. A variety of enriching activities are provided during breakfast and after school clubs to support with personal development skills. To support targeted PP pupils with their social and emotional needs.	Family Link Worker (FLW) Thinking Skills program	Family Link Worker employed to support disadvantaged families. Weekly meetings to support vulnerable families with housing, behaviour management classes. Supporting pupils with social and emotional development sessions including, relaxation exercises, emotion exploration, bereavement counselling etc. Thinking Skills program for PP children with behavioural issues. Pupils participate in daily PSHE sessions and sporting activities with a Learning Mentor. Parents engage in weekly review meetings with behaviour management strategies with the FLW. To support pupils with removing barriers to their learning through group work, mentoring and attendance of sports events.	Learning Mentors	Two learning mentors employed to support pupils across, who need to develop skills to manage their behaviour for learning.
