

# **Sports Tournaments**





Our sports teams have been vey busy. We came second in the Moving Matters Netball tournament, with Ade being named Best Player. We won 10-1 against Reay Primary in the Lambeth Football League and today we came second in the Moving Matters Basketball Competition. Good job everyone.





The focus book of this week is *Jack And The Giant Beanstalk*. The children were making their own books of the story, cutting and sticking the pictures of the story and retelling the story as they looked at the pictures they were sticking. Children were repeating words from the book such as saying "high up top", fe fi fu fom", bessi the cow". This activity has been supporting the children's communication and language as they have been learning new words and use them for their play and story time.

The children also have been doing lots of planting. They were looking at different seeds and making their own plants to take home to look after. This has supported the children's understanding of the world, learning about plants, how they grow and looking after the environment.

In the next 2 weeks we will be looking further into planting and growing outdoors.









In English, our learning will based on the 'Handa's Surprise' story book, with its vibrant and colourful illustrations on the front cover and a lovely surprise inside.

This book will allow us to explore names of fruits, animals, colours and adjectives/describing words.

In Maths, our learning will be around the concept of subtraction, using the 'Handa's Surprise' book.

# Pre-School

Over the next two weeks, in Literacy, we will be reading and retelling the stories of *The Little Red Hen* and *Jasper's Beanstalk*. We will be writing shopping lists, making marks to represent words or using the sounds we know.

In Maths we will be exploring weight and capacity when measuring the amounts of cooking ingredients. Using pretend-play such as a Baker's Shop role- play, we will be experimenting with changing amounts whilst selling pretend bakery goods that we have made using playdough.

In Understanding of the World, we will be looking at processes and change through experiences such as baking bread. We will talk about decay by observing how vegetables and fruit change from when they are fresh. We will be talking about the importance of recycling and composting, and talking about how our fruit leftovers will return to the soil to help plants grow.

In Expressive Arts and Design we will be making story props and masks to support our role play. We will continue to develop our role-play based around the books we have read. In PSED, we will be talking about team work and the importance of helping each other. We will also talk about the importance of looking after our natural environment and how we can achieve it if we all work together to help our planet.









The reception children have been exploring our new "Reading tent". They are very excited about this new reading space.

In Maths next week we will continue to explore number compositions or different ways to add up to different numbers from 1-10.

In Science next week, we will continue to explore what do we need to do to have a healthy and balanced diet. The reception children this week had the opportunity to taste some healthy food.

We cooked a beetroot soup they also learnt how to use different cooking tools such as knives or potato peelers.

We have three new "ladybird houses". This term the children will be learning about different insects we can find in the local area. Next week, we will be sowing different vegetables related to the story "Eddie's garden" by Sara Garland.

# Reception

# Year 1

In English next week, we will be looking at creating new imaginary settings in order to write an alternative ending to the story we are focussing on 'Beegu'. In Maths, we will continue to focus on length and height. We will focus on standard and non-standard units of measurement.

In Science, we will learn about Carl Linnaeus and why he is an important scientist. In DT next week we will continue to learn about moving pictures. We will start to design our project by thinking about mechanisms for movement.

This week, in Humanities, we will be learning how to plot a route. We will look at the countries Amelia Earhart flew through.

















In English, year 2 will be looking at writing a story based on *Toby and The Great Fire of London*. We will be exploring adjectives, expanded noun phrases and adverbs to make our stories exciting.

In Maths, we will be exploring 3D shapes. We will be finding out about vertices, edges, and faces as well as seeing what 3D shapes we can find in our everyday lives.


In Science we will be investigating how some materials change because of the heat or the cold. We will be looking at what is an irreversible change and what changes are reversible. In Art we will be exploring brush strokes. We will be looking at how our paintings are effected by the way we use are brushes and how different textures can be made.

In Humanities the children will be looking at how London has changed since the Great Fire of London. They will be looking at what decisions were made after the fire to prevent another one from happening, such as the introduction of the fire brigade.

# Year 3









In English next week, the children will be continuing their work on the book 'Skyward'. The children are focusing on comparing the characters in the text and looking at how subordinate clauses can add tension and detail to their writing.

In Maths, we are in our final week of length and perimeter. The children will be starting to add and subtract lengths, as well as calculating and investigating perimeter.

In Science, the children are looking at the different sources of light- artificial, natural and the properties of natural light.

In Art/DT, the children will be continuing their work on tone and shade.

Next week, 3A and 3B will be going on a trip to the National Army Museum. They will be attending a workshop there, where they will consolidate their knowledge of WWII and The Blitz.

Don't forget your packed lunches and your coats!

In English, we will continue to look at play scripts and adapting Paddington on stage. We will then begin to look at biography writing, honing in on key figures from the Industrial Revolution.

In Maths next week, our focus will be decimals. We will learn how to multiply and divide by 10 and 100. We will also learn how to partition decimal numbers including tenths and hundreds expressed as fractions.

In our next Science lesson, we will be recapping and consolidating our knowledge on electricity and circuits. We will be drawing and labelling circuit diagrams and investigating how to be safe around electricity.

Next week, in DT, we will be learning about basic food hygiene and food preparation. We will be trying and testing existing products on the market to help us create an afternoon tea for Paddington.

In Topic, we continue to look at Peru, the UK and their differences, as well as the Industrial Revolution and how it changed and shaped London.









# Year 4

# Year 5









In English, next week, we will be diving deeper into our class book, 'Coming to England'. Children will begin to plan and write a narrative based on the book using features similar to the author.

In Maths next week, we will study fractions. Nearing the end of this, unit we will multiply fractions by wholes and find fractions of amounts.

In Science, next week, we will be looking at pulleys, levers and gears and how these are used in everyday life.


In Art/DT, we will be planning for our slippers and beginning to learn the basics of sewing.

In Humanities, we will be looking at the differences between the UK and the Caribbean and thinking about how these differences would have affects people who travelled on HMT Windrush.









For the final week of our narrative unit, in English, we will be studying the book 'Varmints', children will take inspiration from the text to plan their own narrative about a society suffering hardships.

Next week, the Mathematics topic is ratio and children will learn to use scale factors and solve ratio and proportion problems.

In Science, we are continuing the topic studied last term. The children will plan and conduct an investigation to demonstrate how light travels.

Linked to topic, children will explore American landmarks, compare structures, identify materials and how they were joined / reinforced.

Using their knowledge of the history and geography of the United States of America, children will identify similarities and differences between the USA and UK.
