

Nursery



The Nursery core book is 'Oliver's Fruit Salad'. The children have been encouraged to look at different parts of the story, retell and write about different parts, as well as using their own imagination to start or end the story.

This week the children have been getting ready for Enterprise, making fruit kebabs, and decorative fruit.

The children are thoroughly enjoying free flowing across the entire EYFS outdoor learning area, which is supporting with transition to Reception.



In Literacy, we are going to be discussing what germs are through the book *"I Don't Want to Wash My*

In Literacy, we are going to be discussing what germs are through the book "I Don't Want to Wash My Hands" by Tony Ross. We will carry on with our "Show and tell" sessions where the children bring an object that is special to them and explains to the class why this item is so special to them.

In Maths, we are learning about how to share equally and halve even numbers. Next week, we are going to explore the difference between even and odd numbers.

In Understanding of the World, we will continue to learn facts about different insects. We are currently building a "Bug Hotel" to encourage biodiversity in the Early Years' outdoors area. Next week, we are going to start to explore processes and changes in the natural world such as states of matter. We will be discussing different states of matter such as solid or liquid.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we will continue to explore how to use different art techniques to express our feelings and emotions. We will continue to explore techniques such as printing or collage using resources available in the environment. We are looking forward to our next school trip the 7th of July. We will be exploring the Dulwich Picture Gallery art collection.

As part of our learning in PSED, we will be discussing how to stay healthy by taking care of our personal hygiene. We will engage in different class discussions about why is important to our health to take care of our own personal hygiene.

Reception

Year 1



Over the next 2 weeks, in English, we will continue to explore and describe key characters and build up to writing diary entries.

In Maths, we will be moving on to explore time to the hour and half past the hour. We will be looking at some time word problems and using our knowledge of time to solve these.

During our final science unit we will be looking closely at the scientific contributions of Beatrix Potter while observing and investigating plants.

Our D.T unit will continue to explore where our food comes from and how it is made.

Throughout our Humanities learning, we will be exploring costal defences and the story '*Grace Darling*'. We will also be looking at the seas and oceans, coastal weather and coastal towns.

On **Thursday 23rd June**, Year 1 will be hosting a fundraiser to help send us to Brighton. This will take place from **3.30pm – 4pm in the Green Zone – everything 50p**!

On **Friday 24th June**, Year 1 will be having a '**Pyjama Day'**. All Year 1 children are encouraged to wear pyjamas to school along with a £1 donation towards reducing the costs for Brighton.

In English, Year 2 will be using the class story, 'Butterfly Park' to write a persuasive letter to encouraging the book characters to visit Butterfly Park. Children will revise their knowledge of verb tenses and different sentence openers to write their persuasive letters.

In Maths, Year 2 will explore measurement and mass. The children will look at how to use weighing scales to measure mass and they will also practise reading scales recording these measurements in grams (g) and kilograms (kg).

In Science, the children are continuing the study of biology. The children will research the key scientist for this term, Jane Goodall.

In Art, Year 2 will learn and practise their sewing skills, looking at how to make different types of stitches. They will start with blanket stitch and move onto cross-stitch, all in preparation for making puppets!

In History, the children will research and compare similarities between historical events that occurred in London and Tokyo: The Great Fire of London and The Great Fire of Meireki. In Geography, children will explore Tokyo maps using compass points and the language of direction.

Year 2

Year 3









In English, next week, we will be starting a new topic: 'Non-Chronological Reports'. We will explore non-chronological reports and identify their features, before writing our own reports about a rainforest animal using subheadings to group information and a range of conjunctions.

In Maths, next week, we will resume our topic 'Geometry', which we started before Enterprise and Creativity Week. We will learn to identify horizontal, vertical, perpendicular and parallel lines and describe and construct 2D and 3D shapes.

In Science, next week, we will research the scientist Elsie

Widdowson by extracting key information about her area of study, findings and achievements.

In our next DT lesson, we will learn about the dangers in the kitchen and how to be safe and clean.

In Geography, next week, we will research the Amazon Rainforest. We will locate it on a map, identify the factors that make it habitable and describe the biome that the Amazon Rainforest is located in using a range of sources.

Year 4 have enjoyed learning about, and creating advertising during, Enterprise week. Next week, we will begin exploring the fiction story 'The Last Wild'. Word of the week: globe

We have learned about budgets and features of a payslip during Enterprise week. Next week we will be starting our unit on shapes, looking at types of triangles, quadrilaterals, and lines of symmetry. Word of the week: rectilinear

Our new Science topic this term is States of Matter, which the children began investigating through their water cycle homework. Next week, we will continue our learning by classifying materials as solids, liquids, or gasses.

Words of the week: objective

This term, in DT, we are continuing our theme of Saving Our World by looking at sustainability. We will be learning how to sew and making our very own bags for life! Words of the week: reuse

Next week, year 4 are delving into how the Industrial Revolution changed what work people did, how it changed London, and what life would have been like for a child labourer during the Industrial Revolution.

Words of the week: reason



Year 5



Next week, the children will be creating a narrative based on our class book '*Millions*'. Children will write a story with two main characters who find something in their local area.

Next week, in Maths, we are looking at shape. Children will look at symmetry, reflection, translation and rotation of shapes on a grid.

Next week, in Science, we are looking at mixtures and solutions. Children will learn how to practically sort a mixture into separate solids and also how to remove solids from solutions.

Next week, we will start our DT project. Children will look at packaging and the properties of this and begin to understand how different materials are chosen and how the packaging is designed.

In Humanities next week, children will be having their first trading session on Wednesday. Children will use our class currency to trade items they have made within their business.



In English, we will begin to look at The Lady of Shalott and explore themes and topics around the poem.

Next week, children will use all they have learned in mathematics to investigate how the subject links to fields outside of the expected, such as design and architecture.

The children will continue to look at how our bodies work and investigate the circulatory system in Science.

In Art, the children will be designing, making and preparing props and costumes for their end of year production.

In Humanities, the children will continue to link their topic of Survival and the Titanic.
