The children will continue to work on addition and subtraction facts.





Some children in year 5 have been participating in a creative writing project run across a number of primary schools in Lambeth.




In Literacy, we have been reading the story of *The Gingerbread Man*. The children enjoyed retelling the story using pictures and appropriate vocabulary related to the story.

In Maths, our number of the week was 13. The children counted 13 objects as well as practised writing the number. They also looked at numbers before and after the number 13. They now have an understanding that 13 is the beginning of teen numbers.

In Understanding of the World the children used role play and gave instructions to their partners of how to use a race track and an obstacle course.

In Expressive Arts and Design, the children used the idea of a race to see who was going to build the structure first.

As part of our learning in PSED The children are continuing to build friendships and work on getting along and sharing.



Next week, in Literacy, the children are writing letters to teachers all about their favourite memories in Reception. They will also be thinking about what they have learnt and writing job applications for roles they think they would be good at.


In Maths, we are going to be exploring and investigating relationships between numbers and shapes. Children will also continue to copy, continue and create a widening range of repeating patterns and symmetrical constructions.

In Understanding of The World, next week, we'll be learning about the important people in our community and their jobs and discussing what job the children want to have when they grow up.

In Art, next week, children will be drawing pictures of what they want to be when they grow up and labelling them.

Reception

Year 1



Over the next 2 weeks, in English, we will be looking at recounts. We will be exploring features in order to write our own recount about a personal experience.

In Maths, we will be moving on to Geometry. We will be looking at positional language including the, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

During our final Science unit, we will continue to look at plants. We will focus on understanding what plants need to grow from a seed as well as identifying a range of plants.

Through our D.T unit, we will explore a range of foods and vegetables in the context of making a healthy sandwich.

Throughout our Humanities learning, we will be exploring coastal weather. We will also be looking at organising events in chronological order.

In English, Year 2 will be learning the difference between fiction and nonfiction writing, identifying the main points then sequence a non-chronological report.

In Maths, Year 2 will be learning about temperature. We will get a chance to read a thermometer and say whether the reading is hot or cold. We will also be adding and subtracting numbers using the column method.


In Science, Year 2 will be learning about Habitats. We will do an investigation of where different animals live around our school environment.

In Art, Year 2 will be carefully sewing the decorations on our hand puppet and neatly sewing both sections of our puppet together.

In Humanities, Year 2 will be learning about significant buildings and about events that happened in and around Lambeth over the years.

Year 3



In English next week, we will be continuing with our Narrative writing based on the story 'The Explorer'. We will explore using a range of writing techniques such as metaphors and expanded noun phrases to write a setting description.

In Maths next week, we will be learning about 'Capacity'. We will learn to use litres, millilitres and standard scales to measure and compare liquids.

In Science, we will identify the right types and amount of nutrition animals and humans need in order to maintain a balanced diet.

In our next DT lesson, we will be sampling a range of tortilla and dip combinations looking at the nutritional value of existing products and rating the quality of taste.

In the next History lesson, we will be researching about Mayan gods and understand the Mayans' beliefs about the underworld. In the next Geography lesson, we will be exploring the impact the rainforest has on humans, with a close focus on deforestation.

This week we have been revisiting triangles and exploring different angles. Next week, we will begin learning about interpreting coordinates, and use this knowledge to plot points on a grid.

Word of the week: quadrant

Our new Science topic, this term, is States of Matter. We will be investigating materials as they change state in a hands-on experiment next week.

Word of the week: water cycle

This term in DT, we are continuing our theme of Saving Our World by looking at sustainability. This week we learned about and practiced making different types of sewing stitches.

Word of the week: repurpose

Next week, year 4 will analyse a range of historical sources in order to examine the negative impacts the Industrial Revolution had on the environment and people's health.


