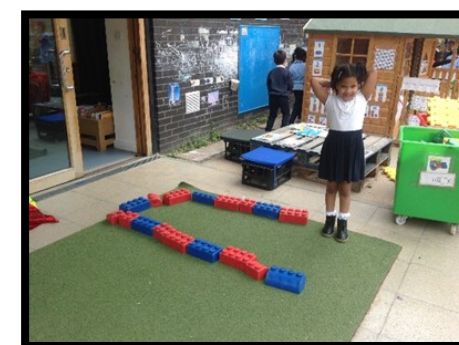
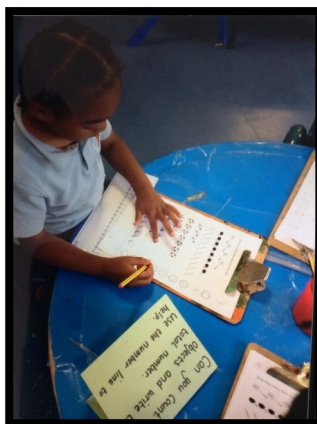
Summer Fair

Nursery



As the weather has warmed up we have made ice cubes with alphabets in them. We asked the children to see if they could guess the sound in the ice cube and then find a way, using their logic to take out the letter sound from the ice cube. Did they guess right? Great work!

In Maths, the children were using their knowledge of counting to count objects and write the corresponding number. UW: "I can be what I want to be," is the book we were looking at. So The children were pretending to be ice-cream vendors, making different flavours of ice-cream. In Expressive Arts and Design: The children were playing instruments, making their favourite tunes. Collaborating and taking turns.



In Literacy, we are going to be discussing the things we are good at through the book "Rain before Rainbows" by Smiriti Halls. We will talk about how to have a growth when something adverse happens to us.

In Maths, we will recap numerical patterns such as even and odd numbers or double facts. We will continue to explore repeated patterns. We will continue to develop our spatial awareness by drawing and reading maps.

In Understanding of the World, we will continue to explore the different seasons and how to stay safe during a heat wave. We will be talking about climate change and the consequences it has in our daily life.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we will continue to explore how to use different art techniques to express our feelings and emotions. We will continue to explore techniques such as printing or collage using resources available in the environment, we will create rainbows using these techniques.



Reception

Year 1



In English, we will be looking at recounts. We will be exploring features in order to write our own recount about a personal experience. In Maths, we will be moving on to Geometry. We will be looking at positional language including the half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

During our final Science unit, we will continue to look at plants. We will focus on understanding what plants need to grow from a seed as well as identifying a range of plants.

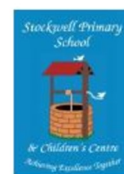

This week, the children will look briefly at limerick poems and learn the features and structure of this fun poetry style.

The children will continue to revise and consolidate all of the topics covered in Year 2 in preparation for their learning in Year 3 .

This week, the children will celebrate the end of Year 2 and Key Stage 1 with class parties. They will also have the opportunity to visit their new classroom and meet their teachers for next year.

Year 3



In English this term, we have studied 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell, which tells the adventure of a group of children lost in the rainforest. In Maths this term, we have learnt about Geometry and Mass and Capacity. Looking at angles, shapes and measuring as well as comparing units of liquids. In Science this term, our focus has been Animals including humans.

Where we identified that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food. We also learnt about the different skeletons humans and animals have and understood how muscles are for support, protection and movement.

In DT this term, our Food Technology lessons have focus on tortilla chips. Corn was a key part of the Mayan diet. We enjoyed testing a variety of chip and dip combinations. In History, we have learnt about the Mayan Civilization and their achievements. In the next Geography lesson, we will be exploring the impact the rainforest has on humans, with a close focus on deforestation. In Geography, we have identified the location of rainforests around the world and why they are located there. We have focused on the Amazon Rainforest in Central / South America. We also looked at the role of the rainforest in terms of trade, natural resources and human settlements.



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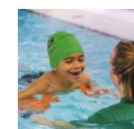
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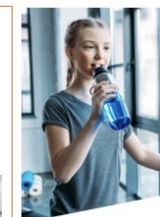

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In English, we have looked at writing instructions. We have recapped key features including imperative verbs and why it is important to use them.

In Maths, we have consolidated our learning and applied it to economics, learning how the country works and what a recession is.

In Science, we looked at the boiling and melting point for different states of matter and watched how they changed into new states.

In D&T we have sewn our bags. It took a lot of resilience but we are really proud of the outcomes

We have finished our 'Saving Our World' topic but we have been observing the current weather and understanding how humans have contributed to the extreme heat we are facing and why it is so concerning.

Year 5

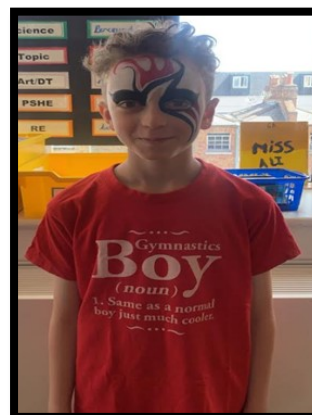
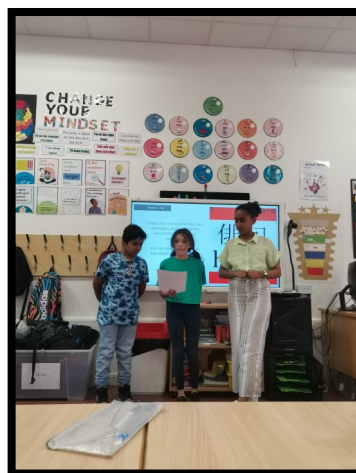
