

Nursery




Welcome to a new academic year. We know that your child/ children will enjoy learning and growing in the Nursery.

In Maths, The children counted to the number 5 and put the corresponding number of owls in the nests to match the numbers.

In Physical Development, the children enjoyed climbing and jumping off the climbing frame onto a mat, using the jumping and climbing technique. They used the muscles in their legs and arms to help them.

Expressive Arts and Design: The book of the week was, "*Owl Babies*" which the children enjoyed reading and discussing. They used the information from the book to recreate the owl mum and her babies. They cut, stuck and used their initiative in choosing the right materials (feathers, buttons and other materials) for different parts of the owl.

Communication and Language: The book of the week was, "*Owl Babies*" which the children enjoyed reading and discussing. They used the language from the story and retold the story to adults as well as to their peers. They also acted out the story using boxes, which were the owls' bodies, and they used dialogue from the story itself. Eg: "I want my mummy".



Next week in Literacy, we are reading the book 'So Much!' Children will then retell the story through role play. They will be encouraged to use words from the story to support their retelling.

Next week in Maths, the children will learn that collections of objects can be sorted into sets based on attributes such as colour, size or shape. They will be given lots of opportunities to find and match objects which are the same and play lots of matching games throughout the week.

In understanding the world, the children are going to talk about members of their immediate families and why they are important to them. They will then all create a family portrait using a range of artistic methods




Over the next 2 weeks in English, we will be looking at the fictional text 'Amazing Grace'. We will focus on character descriptions, past tense and we will write our own version of the story making a change to the narrative.

In Maths, we will focus on place value. We will learn different ways to partition numbers and use this to solve problems.

This term, in Science, we are learning about Nutrition. We will focus on what makes a healthy and balanced lunch as well as sorting food into groups.


In Art we will start by exploring collages and different artists who used this technique.

Throughout our humanities topic, we will be learning about 'Inspirational people'. We will learn how to place key inspirational figures on a timeline.



Year 2

Year 3




In English, we are continuing our work on play scripts. We will be looking at the different features of play scripts and will be writing our own play script scene.

In Maths, we are carrying on with place value, looking specifically at standard and non-standard partitioning.

In Science, we are continuing our work on rocks, looking at the different types of rocks and how they are formed.

In Art/DT, we are looking at pop up books and trying out different folds.

In History, we are continuing our work on Ancient Egypt, focusing on its Geographical location and the Ancient Egyptian way of life.



We have enjoyed starting our Roman English topic by studying the story of Romulus and Remus and look forward to continuing this. Next week, we will be beginning to plan and write our own version of this exciting, deadly myth.

Next week in Maths, we will continue understanding place value. We will look at partitioning numbers in multiple ways and we will continue to develop confidence in reading and writing larger numbers.

Next week in Science, we will begin our topic of Animals including Humans. We will start to study the human body and the functions of our teeth.

Next week in Art, we will begin to design Roman coins, understanding the patterns used and the significance of the people on the coins.

Next week in Topic, we will sequence and timeline to understand the Roman era and begin to understand this period of time.



Year 4

Year 5

This half term, in line with our topic of Time Travellers where we will be visiting different periods of time and using this to write some wonderful narratives and Historical pieces. We will be looking at the text Beowulf. This week we used our drama skills to act out the story helping us to understand the order of events. It's all about Place Value in Year 5. We will be using manipulatives and physical objects to help us to solidify our knowledge on Place Value. Throughout the weeks we will be depending on our understanding using guided and unguided worded problem practice to ensure we have secure knowledge.



This half term we are learning about Living things and their Habitats. We have started by doing biographies on the first Chief Midwife of the NHS. Our Art and D&T will be taught inline with our topic. We started with a beautiful piece that represents our theme of time travelling. We will be starting an exciting project where we will be designing and making a Viking boat. We will be looking at a range of historical periods from the Stone Age to Mediaeval times. This week we have begun by creating




a timeline of our periods.



The children will start their streaming groups and begin with a non-chronological report on Ancient Benin to help develop their understanding of the time.

We will begin with place value and look at ordering and understanding numbers up to 10 million!




For Science, we will continue to look at evolution, inheritance and adaptation and study more of Charles Darwin's theories and how they have impacted the scientific community.

The children have been looking at different African tribes and how their colours and patterns represent them. They will continue to do this as they build up to creating their own wall hanging

inspired by tribal cultures.

In History and Geography, the children will develop their understanding of where Benin

once stood and what happened to the people who lived there.
