In Literacy, we are going to focus on our key text, 'Tell Me More About Ramadan'. The children will be encouraged to understand different religious beliefs. They will also engage in conversations about the story which will allow them to learn new vocabulary. In Maths, we are going to be linking the right amount of objects to match numbers up to 5. In Understanding of the World, the children will continue to develop their positive attitudes of different communities through acting out the celebration of Ramadan.



In Expressive Arts and Design, we will be creating our own repeating patterns to represent different Islamic art. As part of our learning in PSED, we will have special guests coming into nursery to talk about Ramadan and how they celebrate it.



In Literacy, we are starting to write short sentences with sound to letter correspondence. We will be able to use the sounds we know to help us to write letters and captions.

In Maths, next week we will start to explore the

composition of numbers from 1-5. We will also learn how to count backwards and forwards from 1-5. We will explore how to substitute any number from 0-5.

Next week we will continue to explore different beliefs through our topic "Celebrations". We will continue to explore how different cultures celebrate special festivals. We will be learning about Eid and discussing why this festival is so important for some communities. We will continue to explore different art techniques such as collage that will allow us to express our own feelings and emotions through our art work. In PSED, we will continue to learn how to think about the perspective of others through books like "Elmer" by David McKee. We will also explore what makes us different and unique.







In English, we will continue with diary entries and will write in role as Boudicca, the warrior Queen. Looking at the key events in her life and her battle with the Romans. In Maths, we will continue to practise our timetables, looking at patterns and skills we can use to help us solve multiplication and division problems.

In Science, our topic this term is Sound. We will design and create a range of musical instruments made from recycling items to listen to, test the instruments to explore what part of it is vibrating allowing it to make a sound. In DT, we will look at a range of Roman catapults and their mechanisms and discuss what materials the Romans would have used to create their catapults. In Geography, we will compare the differences and similarities of land use in different Roman settlements and then we will create tourist brochures to persuade visitors to come to our Roman settlement.



In English, the children are going to be exploring non-chronological reports, with a focus on the Ancient and modern day Olympics.

In Maths, the children are discovering more about multiplication, with a focus on the 8 times tables and looking for patterns amongst the 2, 4 and 8 times tables.

In Science, the children will be investigating which types of surfaces will create more friction using different textured ramps and toy cars.

In Art, the children are going to examine mark making in pottery and the different methods used to create Greek vases.

In History, the children are researching the life of people in Ancient Greece and comparing them to those who lived in Ancient Egypt.

Year 5



This half term, in English, we have been learning all about the Highwayman. Moving on from the adventures we have been following the tragic love story of a highwayman. We have challenged ourselves to learn a huge amount of new vocabulary along the way. We have loved using drama and freeze frames to solidify our understanding.

In Maths, it's all about fractions this half term and we have been using our multiplication knowledge to help us. We have been using practical resources to deepen our understanding of equivalent fractions. In Science, this half term we are learning about Space. We started with a biography of Dr Maggie Aderin Pocock.

Our Art and D&T will be taught inline with our topic. We will be drawing Viking ships and started this week by analysing different ships.


