## **Our Weekly Update**

On Thursday, Ms Kelleher hosted our annual Year 6 SATs parent meeting. This was well attended and the feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. If you have not yet received the slides, please contact the school office and they will be sent to you. We also held our Writing parent workshop and drop-in. There were parents in nearly every classroom enjoying sessions and finding out more about how to support children at home. Thank you to everyone who has come along to our school events.

There has been a lot in the news about the upcoming strikes. We will be <u>closed</u> on <u>Wednesday 1st February</u> due to the industrial action. Based on the information that we have about the number of teachers striking, it would not be safe to open. We appreciate how inconvenient it is that school will be closed and can assure you that this decision has not been taken lightly. We will update you about future dates as the situation evolves.

We sent out our parent survey and the feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. 91% of families notice that this school makes improvements for the benefit of the children, of which 25% strongly agree with this statement. 98% of families believe the curriculum offered to the children is broad and balanced, of which 18% strongly agree. 96% of families believe the school provides opportunities that help their child to learn, of which 32% strongly agree. It is brilliant to have such string support from the parent community and we will continue to focus on developing further. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this.

If you are sending your child to school with a packed lunch, please ensure that this is healthy. Please make sure that your child has a balanced lunch including fruit, vegetables, carbohydrates (e.g. pasta, bread, rice, potato), and protein (e.g. chicken, egg, cheese, beans, tofu, Quorn). Cakes and biscuits are allowed, but please limit these to one per day. School lunches are a great option

Starting today, we will no longer be using the side gate at the front of the school. Please enter and exit via the gate in the courtyard. The safest point of entry continues to be Burgoyne Road, which is a school street. We encourage you to use this entrance.

Next Friday, 10th February, is Love and Friendship Day. We would love for all of the children to come in wearing red, for a £1 donation. There will also be a cake sale after school. Don't forget your baked goods and your spending money!

Year 3&4 Multiplication Check Workshop

#### **Pre-School**



This week, the children have been listening to the story 'Naughty Bus'. The activities were set up linking to the story to support the children's Maths, Language and Physical Development.



The children have been doing lot of junk modelling to create a bus by painting together as a group. This has been developing their fine motor skills and helped with their social skills and friendships. The children have decorated biscuits to create a bus. This adult led activity supported the children with understanding and following simple instructions. It helped them learn new words to extend their vocabularies.



The children also used different construction blocks to count from 1-5 in a sequence.

They used their imaginations to create different structures.









In Literacy, we are going to focus on our key text, 'Commotion in the Ocean'. The children will be encouraged to engage in conversations about the story which will allow them to learn new vocabulary.

In Maths, we are going to learn about different positions through using words – for example, "The bag is <u>under</u> the table".

In Understanding the World, we will learn about different countries in the world and we will discuss the differences between a range of different countries.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we will be exploring colour mixing to create our own beach.

As part of our learning in PSED, we will learn how to develop our confidence in new social situations .

#### Attendance



Next week, in Literacy our core book for the week will be '*Clean Up!*' by Nathan Bryon. The focus will be on writing short sentences with capital letters and full stops. We will make posters to put up around school encouraging other pupils to keep their school clean and recycle.

Children will learn that even though Rocket (the main character in our book) is small, she can still have a positive impact on the world by encouraging everyone to clean up the beach. We will then discuss how the children can have a positive impact on the world themselves.



In Maths, the children will compare mass, seeing which is heavier/lighter. They will also compare different capacities seeing which is full, half full and empty.

In Understanding The World, the children will be comparing The Caribbean and England. They will be making observations about the similarities and differences between these countries.

In Expressive Art and Design, we will be making a large



scale recycled art project, creating collaboratively and sharing ideas, resources and skills.

In Art/DT, we are looking at sketching, and we will use sketching techniques to help us sketch London.

In History, we are continuing to look at World War 2. We will be focusing on food shortages and rationing. landmarks.

In English, we will recap the features of a non-chronological report, conduct research and begin planning for our own nonchronological reports on Peru.

In Maths, we will look at the perimeter of rectilinear shapes and find missing lengths.

In Science, we will recap our knowledge of electricity, construct our own circuits and investigate the barriers of electricity flow.

In Art, we will examine Hockney's use of lines and perspectives and draw the outline of a Peruvian landscape in the style of David Hockey's work.

In History, we will use primary and secondary sources to research the London Underground and create leaflets.









#### Year 5



have been combining our knowledge of fractions and multiplication to multiply fractions by integers. We have been using various different methods (repeated addition and partitioning) to support us in doing this.

In Maths, we have been revisiting fractions. We



In English, we have been writing a diary entry from the perspective of a Windrush passenger. We have also been exploring and identifying the key features of a non-chronological report, in preparation for next week when we will be writing our own news reports based on the Windrush.

In Science, we have continued exploring forces. In our lesson this week, we carried out an investigation to help us explain how gravity acts. This helped us to identify the direction of gravity's pull and how it affects our everyday life.



Our Art and D&T lessons have been in line with our topic focus – Windrush. This week we have been experimenting with our own mark-making using watercolour paints. We have used Brianna McCarthy's (a Caribbean artist) portraits to replicate some of the marks she has used.



In Science, children will investigate how refraction changes the direction in which light travels.

In Art, the children will observe and draw themselves as realistically as they can, following the style of Norman Rockwell.



In Maths, we will continue with our unit of 'Decimals'. We will revisit how to multiply and divide by 10,100, 1000 and practise how to multiply/divide decimals by a given integer.





In History, the children will learn about gold rush and how gold influenced the movement in the West of USA.
