
Year 2 SATS

Pre-School

This week, the preschool children have been focusing on developing on their physical and social development. This is linked to the story of the week, 'Amazing'. The story supports the children's learning about the importance of understanding and acceptance different needs and abilities.

The preschool children were playing together, taking turns and sharing to paint and make marks. Painting helps the children to develop their fine motor skills and to be able to hold and use mark making tools appropriately. To support the children's hand and eye coordination, they were using large tweezers to grip pom-poms and count from 1-5, in sequence, extending their maths skills.

The children were taking turns in using the climbing frames to improve their gross motor skills, develop their physical strength and encourage early problem solving. Climbing allows the children to think about where they need to place their hands and feet to balance. It encourages them to think of finding different routes and movements to balance safely.



In Literacy, we are going to focus on our key text, 'Ten Seeds'. The children will be encouraged to engage in conversations about the story, which will allow them to learn new vocabulary.

In Maths, we are going to be reciting numbers in the correct order, beyond 5. We will also be linking the right amount of objects to match numbers up to 5.

In Understanding of the World, we will be learning about different plants and how to care appropriately for them.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we will be playing a wide range of instruments to express our feelings and ideas through music.

As part of our learning in PSED, we will learn about the importance of classroom rules and why we must follow them.

Attendance

Next term, in Literacy, we will read a range of books all focussed around plants and how they grow. We will use these core books to explore the magic of new plant life as we approach springtime.

In Maths, next term, in the first week, back we'll be comparing height (taller/shorter) and length (longer/shorter) using natural resources.

In Understanding The World, the children will be watching a teacher model how to draw an observational picture of a plant. The children will then go outside and observe plants, being able to observe and draw the natural world around them independently. In Art and Expressive design, we will be letting children do bark and leaf rubbings while out observing plants and trees on a nature walk.

In PSED, children will learn about the importance of listening. Who do we listen to? Why do we listen?

We love learning together!






On the first week back, after

half term, we will be focusing on a new book 'Toby and the Great Fire of London'. We will also be talking about the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts.

In Maths, we will continue to learn multiplication and division, focusing on odd and even numbers, multiplying and dividing by 5 and 10.

We will continue to learn about materials. The scientist of the term will be Noah Vicker, who created Play-Doh.

This term, in DT, we will be designing and creating free-standing, wooden framed, structured Tudor houses with card walls.

In the first week back, in Geography, we will be learning how to use atlases in order to find places.

After half term, in English, we will be looking at poetry, identifying and using poetic devices and then writing our own poems.

In Maths, we are starting our new topic on fractions, understanding what they are and how we write them.

In Science, we are beginning our new topic of light, focusing on key people involved in light, the sun and the dangers of UV rays.



In Art/DT, we are looking at digital art, having a go at taking pictures and editing them using software on the computer.

In History, we are continuing to look at World War 2, focusing on the Blitz and the aftermath of bomb damage in Great Britain.

Next term, in English, we will be learning about playscripts based on Paddington on the London Underground.


In Maths, we will continue with fractions with a focus on improper fractions and converting mixed numbers into improper fractions.

In Science, we will continue with our Electricity topic through a range of investigations. Our new Scientist for the term will be Annie Easley (NASA human calculator).

In DT, we will research existing products and design and make tasty and appealing products for Paddington's high tea.

In Geography, we will learn about the geographical features of Peru and compare them to the UK.

In History, we will explore the social impact of the London Underground on workers, the environment and businesses.

What a half term it has been! We have most recently written a fact file on the Windrush! They were absolutely fantastic.

In Maths, we have been doing fantastically at learning about multiplying fractions and most recently decimals!



This half term, we are learning about forces. We did an experiment investigating the link between forces and weight.


We have been working up to a project inspired by Brianna McCarty. We even took our very own pictures on our trip to use as our background.



We have been learning about the HMT Empire Windrush. We have been learning how it changed the UK and how this fit into the UK's wider reaction to WW2. We went on a school trip to a Caribbean restaurant where we were taught how to make Jerk chicken!

The children will look at new narrative text, 'Varmints' and will be taught how to shift formality within a piece of writing.

In Maths, we will move on to Fractions, Decimals and Percentages and practise how to convert between these.



In Science, children will continue with our topic of 'Light' and will carry out an investigation about how light travels.


In DT, the children will explore range of iconic structures around the world. We will then investigate materials used to build them.

In History, the children will continue with our 'Route 66' topic and compare how Jamestown, a town in USA, has changed over the time.

Q4) What is your favourite thing about Project X sessions?


My favourite thing is to use the adventure map and search for new places with new adventures. The characters from the stories are always looking forward to find new exciting challenges.
