

#### Attendance

#### **Pre-School**

This week, the preschool children have been exploring fresh vegetables and planting sunflower seeds. The children were looking at the different types of vegetables, naming them, discussing about the different textures and talking about healthy eating.

The activities have supported the children to learn new words to extend on their vocabularies and have an understanding on healthy eating. To support the children's early maths skills, we were also looking at the different shapes, sizes, weight and colours of the vegetables.

The children have also been planting sunflower seeds that links with this weeks book 'Sam Plants A Sunflower'. The children have developed new skills and learned about basic science and nature from growing plants and crops. The children will be looking after their plants over the next few weeks and watching their plant grow giving them responsibility of caring for plants.







In Literacy, we are going to focus on our core book *Lola Plants a Garden'*. Children will be encouraged to retell the story through drawing which will enable them to extend conversations and use a wider range of vocabulary.

In Maths, we are learn to recite and write numbers past 5. Say one number for each item in order: 1,2,3,4.






In Expressive Arts and Design, we are exploring drawing with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.

Next week, we will finish our fiction text '*Toby and the Great Fire of London*' and write our own version of the story. The following week we will look at how to write instructions.

In Maths, we will continue look at measurement. We will learn about mass and how to measure it using weighing scales.

We will continue to learn about materials and think about how materials change through squeezing, twisting, stretching and bending.

In DT, we will look at architecture and design of 17<sup>th</sup> century houses, in preparation for making our own Tudor houses.

#### Young Mathematical Story Author Competition



Winners Announced: Friday 13th May Prize: £100 for winner & £100 for winner's school

The Young Mathematical Story Author (YMSA) competition is the world's first annual international competition set up to encourage young mathematics learners (8-15 years old) from around the world to embed their mathematics learning in a meaningful and engaging context through creating their own mathematical story picture book.

#### **Judging Criteria**

•Clearly explain the chosen mathematical concept in the story without assuming readers' knowledge of the topic

•Embed the chosen mathematical concept (only one topic or focus) in a meaningful context

•Show how characters' knowledge of the chosen mathematical topic can help them solve a problem(s)

•Represent the chosen mathematical concept contextually (in words), visually (via page illustrations), and symbolically (via using correct mathematical symbols, notations and language)

•Illustrate the story independently

•Accurately present mathematical concepts within the story

•Come up with an engaging story plot (any genre)

•Balance gender and ethnicity of characters

•Achieve a high standard of overall presentation and writing (e.g. quality of illustrations, use of punctuation, spelling, etc.)

•Do not exceed 10 A4 pages (excluding front and back cover) •Include title, name of author and school on the front cover



measuring jugs. They will be measuring in grams, kilograms, litres and millilitres.

In Science, the children will be investigating light. They will be researching Percy Shaw and how he impacted physics.

In Art, the children are going to examining digital art. They will be using Microsoft Publisher to change and edit pictures as well as finding ways to add to pictures.

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




Next week, in English, we will be completing our play scripts unit. Children will use all of the features we have learnt about and use them independently to write a play based onPaddington Bear. In Maths, we will be adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers with the same denominators. This will be our final week on our fractions topic.

Next week in Science, we will recap our learning of electricity in Spring 1 and further our knowledge of circuits. In DT, we will be testing products that are had in afternoon tea and commenting on their flavour and textures.


Next week in Topic, we will be looking further at the London Underground network and also at the planets polar regions.







#### Year 5





In English, we have been delving deeper into the stories of people that experienced The Windrush. We have been exploring a book written by Floella Benjamin called 'Coming to England'. We have been using this to write our very own diary entries describing her experiences along her journey.

In Math, we have been exploring fractions, percentages and decimals. We have been using our knowledge of all three to show equivalent amounts in different forms.

In Science, we have been looking closely at mechanisms. This week, we have written our own biography's on a famous scientist, (Kirkpatrick Macmillan), who invented a version of a mechanism we all use today – bicycles!

Our Art and D&T lessons have been in line with our topic focus – Windrush. We have continued to show the experience and impact of the Windrush in the areas in England (Brixton) through art form.





For English, the children will continue to look at a new text called 'Varmints' and explore the issues raised in it through narrative writing.

In Maths, we will be continuing to look at decimals and apply their understanding of



them to fractions and percentage.



In Science, we'll continue to study light and how we see things. The children will look at how light can refract and reflect.

In DT, we will begin to look at significant American structures and what makes them iconic.

In Humanities, we will continue our journey along

Route 66 with Erin, Mia and Josh and look at the geographical features of the states that the route passes through.
