

On 24th of April, the Stockwell School Council went to the Houses of Parliament. We went there to find out about how decisions are made for the country, a bit like how the School Council make decisions for the school. We went inside the House of Lords and the House of Commons. In the House of Commons there are 650 MPs (Members of Parliament) that work there. They are elected by the people in this country and represent all the different parts of the country. At the end of the day, we even got to meet Florence Eshalomi! She is the MP for the Vauxhall constituency (area), where you'll find our school. She answered our questions and asked us some questions about the things that are important to us in our community.

Interestingly, we were delayed on our way back to school as there was a protest. Sometimes people protest outside of parliament to get their voices heard.

Fascinating Facts:

Did you know the Houses of Parliament used to be a palace that is why it is sometimes called the Palace of Westminster.

The King has his own royal entrance even though he only visits once a year. We got to see this entrance!

The Houses of Parliament was mostly burned down in 1834 after the Great Fire. The 'new' building was completed in 1860.

Fascinating but true, Hogwarts dining hall is a copy of Westminster Hall which is inside the Houses of Parliament. This is the oldest part of the building and is 924 years old!

The children were making a fruit salad. They all enjoyed making and eating the fruit.

In English, we will be exploring the book 'Mad About Minibeasts!', which will help the children to learn the names of different animals (minibeasts), and learn information about them. This week, the focus is on snails, spiders and caterpillars. Next week, we will be looking at ladybirds, ants and worms.

In Maths, we will be using songs and nursery rhymes to help the children learn the numbers up to 5,10 and 20. The children will match minibeasts to numerals to help their understanding of number.





As you are aware, our topic is Curious Critters and we are learning about lots of different minibeasts.

In Literacy, we are going to be reading the story of 'The Very Busy Spider' and 'The Very Lazy Ladybird'.



In Maths, we are going to be looking at sequencing events by using words such as 'first' and 'then'. We will also practice counting to 5 and understanding that we need to say one number name for each object we count.

In Understanding of the World, we will be learning about the features of minibeasts, for example that spiders have 8 legs.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we will be using different materials and techniques to recreate minibeasts.

As part of our learning in PSED, we will be working collaboratively and playing group games. This will help us to learn to take turns and understand rules.

Nursery









Next week, in Literacy, we are reading 'The Big Book of Bugs'. We will continue exploring the non-fiction text and using our new found knowledge to write a 'What am I?' riddle where children write clues for someone to guess their minibeast.

In Maths, we will be exploring addition. We will be using first, next and then frames to help us develop our skill of counting on from a given number.

In Understanding of the World, the children will further explore outside and the natural world, while making a bug hotel. They will consider the different habitats of minibeasts and continue going on minibeast hunts.

In Art and Expressive Design, we will be creating bug hotels in collaborative groups, making models, planning and joining different materials.

In PSED, children will talk about how and why we listen, why listening is important and how we can develop our ability to listen for longer periods of time.

Reception

Year 1

In Maths, we will start exploring fractions.

In DT, we experimenting with weaving in nature.


In Humanities, we will be comparing seaside resorts from the Victorian era with modern resorts.

Next week, we will read another book, 'Katie in Scotland', and compare similarities and differences with our class text 'Katie in London'. We will then go on to write a book review.

In Maths, we will continue look at fractions and consolidate our knowledge of how to find fractions of a number or quantity. We will then look at the equivalence of ½ and 2/4 and how to find ¾.

This term, our topic is Plants and our key scientist is botanist, James Wong. We will research this scientist and his work alongside investigating the best conditions for plants to grow.

In Art, we will explore how to use paint and ink to create artwork. We will experiment with mixing primary colours, sketching and drawing.

This term, we will learn all about the capital cities of England and Japan. We will compare key events in the history of London and Tokyo, identify landmarks and look at the human and physical geography of each city.

Year 2

Year 3









In English, the children are moving on to our fiction unit, exploring the 'Just So' origin stories by Rudyard Kipling, focusing on 'The Beginning of the Armadillos.'

In Maths, the children are continuing to explore unit and non-unit fractions and will soon be moving on to money.

In Science, the children will be looking at George Washington Carver and the functions of plants and the requirements for growth.

In Art, we will be comparing and critiquing the art work of Henri Rousseau.

In Humanities, we are exploring the location and climate of the Amazon Rainforest and the Mayan civilisation.









English, we are putting together our ideas from the last two weeks to create our own version of our focus story 'The Promise.'

In Maths, we are continuing with money. We will be calculating, comparing amounts, making estimations and solving money problems.

In Science, we will look at the characteristics of vertebrates and invertebrates, identifying the key parts and differences.

In Art, we will create and annotate mood boards, followed by a line drawing for our print designs.

In Geography, we will explore how electricity is generated and distributed in the UK.

Year 4

Year 5

In English, we will be looking at instructions. We will begin to generate ideas for their instructions, create a word bank of imperative verbs to use and focus on using time conjunctions to explain our methods.

In Maths, we have been learning about the different types of angles. We have explored and used a protractor to practise drawing acute, obtuse, reflex, straight and complete angles. We will be identifying the differences between regular and irregular polygons. We will also be using protractors to measure and label the

angles within these shapes.









In Science, this term we are focussing on materials. We will be exploring the work of a well-known American chemist Stephanie Kwolek, who invented a very strong material called Keylar.

In Art and D&T, this term, we are looking at an artist called Banksy. We will be identifying the features of some of his art works and critique them by discussing the techniques he has used.

In Topic, we will be creating a mini- or micro- society within our classroom. We will learn about how a society is run. We will be focussing on the impact of there being finite amounts of resources in the world.







We wish the children in Year 6 the very best of luck as they embark on their end of Key Stage assessments this week.

They have lots of fun things to look forward to after this week, including a trip to Brockwell Park, a trip to Chessington World of Adventures, and Cycle Proficiency training.
