Attendance

Pre-School



This term the Pre-School children have been looking at different minibeasts, the life cycle of butterflies and they have created a bug hotel using different natural resources. The children enjoyed listening to different stories, identifying and naming different bugs and they used their imagination to make up their own stories by looking at the pictures in the book. This will extend their language skills. The children also went on bug hunts and collected lots of snails and worms for their bug hotel. This has developed their awareness for the care of living creatures and their habitats. The children have practised doing lots of cutting and mark making, which has supported them to strengthen their fine motor skills. They have also used their imagination to create different 3D bugs.

We found a spider in the classroom. Miss Pinto carefully placed the spider inside a container so that we could watch it crawling around.



We loved playing in the water trays this week. We carefully poured water into containers and tubes.



We found these empty fruit boxes and used our imaginations! Sometimes the boxes were cars, sometimes buses and sometimes aeroplanes.



We love playing with the wooden cubes. In the photo, the three children were helping each other to build a wall.



Our topic, after Half Term, will be **“On Your Marks!”**. We will be looking at lots of things that help us to be healthy and independent, for example, brushing teeth, as well as preparing for Sports Day.

In Literacy, we are going to be reading **‘Eat Your Greens Goldilocks’** and **‘Going to the Dentist’**. We will try to start using some letters of the alphabet in our writing.

In Maths, we are going to continue practising saying numbers beyond 5 and making sure that when we count objects we touch each item.

In Understanding of the World, we will learn how people are different and look at some countries and places around the world.

As part of our learning in PSED, we will be thinking about rules and how they help us; for example, when playing a game with a group of children.

Nursery



Next term, in Literacy, we will be reading the book *'My Friends on the Inside'* by Kemi Tijani. After reading the book, the children's comprehension and understanding will be expanded through questioning and role play activities.

In Maths, we will explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10, focusing on double facts. We will use matching pair games and printing to learn all about doubles.

In Understanding the World, the children will explore fruit and vegetables from around the world. They will consider: why they grow where they do and not in other places; what weather/ other conditions they need that are specific to where they are found.

In Expressive Art and Design, we will explore painting, drawing, collage, and modelling of a range of fruits and vegetables.

In PSED, children will talk about food groups and what they provide for our bodies. We will talk about the importance of a balanced diet and why it is important to live a healthy life.

Next term, we will be exploring a new book '*Butterfly Park*'. We will be learning focusing on comparing contrasting settings and well as writing letters.

In Maths, we will be focusing on measuring time, reading clocks to o'clock, half past, quarter to, quarter past and to the nearest 5 minute.

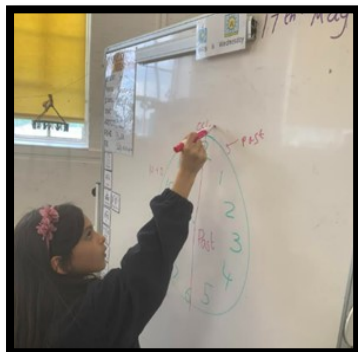
This term, we will learn about living things and their habitats, in Science. We will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.

In DT, next term, we will be learning about how to make puppets based on main characters from key texts.

Next term, we will continue to learn all about Tokyo and London. We will continue to compare key events in the history of London and Tokyo, identify landmarks and look at the human and physical geography of each city.

Year 2

Year 3



In English, the children have been writing their own *'Just So Story'*, and will move onto looking at the poetic works of Dr Benjamin Zephaniah after the half term.

In Maths, the children have been working really hard learning to tell the time past and to the hour on analogue and digital clocks. This will continue for the first week upon their return.

In Science, the children have been exploring the life cycle and pollination of plants as well as investigating how water is transported around plants. After the half term, we will be learning about the work of Elsie Widdowson.

In Art, we will be exploring food hygiene, leading onto the tasting of nachos and dips.

In humanities, we are continuing to explore the Mayan civilisation and the rainforest.

Next term, in English, we will be learning about poems by poet Valerie Bloom. We will also be writing stories set in real places based on the story: *'The Problem of the Hot World'* by Pam Bonsper.

In Maths, we will be consolidating our knowledge on time, by converting between analogue and digital clocks and 24-hour clock. We will then learn about shapes by identifying, comparing and ordering angles.

Our next topic for Science is: States of Matter. We will be comparing and grouping materials, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases. We will take part in a range of observation investigations to see how some materials change state when they are heated or cooled.

In DT, we will continue practising and developing our printmaking skills and create Bags for Life. We will design and make the bags using a textile material.

Our History and Geography lessons continue with the Saving our World topic, deepening our learning on how the Industrial Revolution developed and its impact on the world and the world's climate.

Year 4

Year 5



In English we have been writing poetry using 'The River' to inspire us. We have been using metaphors and repetition to make wonderful poems about poetry. This week we have planned our own poem and chosen our own structure. We also took a trip as year group to the library - we loved choosing our own book!

In Maths, we have been focusing on decimals and building and solidifying our number knowledge. We have been using different pictorial representations to help us. We have also been investigating number and exploring possibilities within Maths.

In Science, we have been studying materials. This week, we are going to be taking part in Science Day where we will take part in different experiments exploring properties of materials and how we test these.

We have been preparing to become the next generation of Banksy artists. We have been practising painting, drawing, stencil making and spray painting skills. Our designs will be outside in the playground - look out for them.

We have been looking at micro societies in History and Geography. We have been looking at human geography - people and places. We have been applying for jobs within our society and looking at key roles in societies.



In English, Year 6 will continue to look at 'Survivors' by David Long and use these stories as inspiration to write their own survival stories.

We will continue our investigation sessions, in Maths, and look at running our own theme park and the costs included with this.

In Science, the children will use the classification system devised by Carl Linnaeus to categorise animals and other living things.

For Art, we will be focusing on create props and sets for our end of year production.

In our History and Geography lessons, we will look into natural disasters, the impact they have on the countries in which they happen and how communities recover from them.
