Portuguese Celebration Event

Pre-School











The Pre-School children have been learning about hygiene, cleaning teeth and the dentist. Children have been engaged in role play, pretending to be dentists. This has supported them to build and expand on their communication and language skills, learning new words that has been supported by the word cards, developed on their social skills and acting out real life experiences. The children used tooth brushes to clean their babies' teeth. They used floss to clean in between the teeth that they had created with blocks and play dough. The children also did mark making through sensory play. While some children were creating early scribbles, some were imitating the way adults write and trying to form recognisable letters.

In Literacy, we are going to be reading "I Can Be Anything!" and "Dear Teacher".

In Maths, we are learning to use 2D shapes to create other shapes.

In Understanding of the World, we will be thinking about different occupations.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we will be singing to match pitch.

As part of our learning in PSED, we will learn about taking part in games together.

Nursery



In Literacy, we are reading the book 'The Koala who could'. We will be talking about what children are looking forward to and nervous about for Year 1. The children will be writing goals for the next school year in letters to their new teacher, to give to them in transition week.

'n Maths, we will explore maps and make our own maps of familiar areas and journeys from our favourite children stories. We will use positional language to explain how characters would journey from one location to another.

In Understanding The World, the children will discuss what they have improved at as the year has gone on. They will also think about what has changed. They will make detailed observations about the natural world around them.

In Art and Expressive design the children are going to invent their own narratives about a new animal that is worried about change. This will help them discuss different ways to help their animal friend.

In PSED children will talk about moving to Year 1. They will discuss the similarities and differences between Reception and Year 1, and how the change makes them feel.

On Friday 23rd June, we celebrated our Caribbean community and the 75th anniversary of The HMT Windrush's first landing in Liverpool on 22nd June, 1948. The community came together to celebrate the legacy of the Windrush generation and spend an afternoon together in the sun.

In the weeks leading up to the event, Ms Thomas and some talented artists from Year 3 completed pieces inspired by Windrush and the Caribbean, and these were displayed during the afternoon.

Year 5 kicked the event off by singing, reminding us why we had all come together and AkomaAsa led the children in art activities and drumming workshops.

We had inflatable orbs, a barber came to line up people's edges, the BBQs were going, Ms Thomas and Ms Bowes painted faces, there were games of dominoes a plenty.

There was food and drink to share and everyone left with a smile on their faces and their tummies full. We even ended the event with a magic show!

We wore red on the day to raise awareness about Sickle Cell disease, which is particularly common in people of African and Caribbean descent. The raffle raised £387, more than paying for the event itself. Our own clothes day raised £200, giving us a total of £246 to donate to the Sickle Cell society.

What an afternoon. Huge thanks to Mr Taylor for spearheading the event and to the team of parents, carers and staff who came together to provide food, time and donations.

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Year 3

















In English, the children have been writing a poem about an animal from the rainforest. They are going to be researching rainforest animals to create a non-chronological report.

In Maths, the children have been exploring the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. They will be moving on to looking at statistics and the variety of ways data is represented.

In Science, the children explored the different parts of a human skeleton. They found facts about the different bones and the purpose of them. They will be exploring muscles.

In DT, they taste tested different dips and chips to decide what they would enjoy on their nachos. They will be making nachos using tortillas and different dips.

In Humanities, they have debated why deforestation should be explored and minimised and the impact it has on the animals, rainforest and environment. They will be looking at the hierarchy of the Mayan Civilisation.

In English, we are drafting our own version of the story 'Greta and the Giants'.

In Maths, we will continue with our topic of geometry, identifying lines of symmetry in 2D shapes.

In Science, we will investigate how water changes state in the water cycle.

In DT, we will be designing our 'bags for life'.

In Humanities, we will be undertaking our end-of-unit assessment for our summer topic, 'Saving our World'.

In English, we have been exploring the features of persuasive writing. We have been using what we have learnt about to write a business proposal, suggesting new ideas for our school.

In Maths, we have been using our multiplication and division knowledge to help us convert different measurements. We have been converting between kilometres and metres as well as millimetres and centimetres.

In Science, we have been investigating different materials and their properties. We have been exploring different chemical changes by identifying whether they are reversible or irreversible.

In DT, we have been exploring the features of different logos. In our last lesson we used Microsoft publisher to design our very own logos.

In Topic, we have been looking into the UK's top 10 trade links. We have been identifying the products and services that we import and export and how this impacts our economy.
